Welcome! This Canvas course space will take you through a four-step assessment that will help us to determine which of our writing courses will be the best starting place for you at UC Irvine.

First, you will be asked to complete two short writing tasks in which you can demonstrate your strengths as a writer and which will also enable us to see which aspects of your writing and communication skill set we can help you develop in our courses. You will then take a short survey that asks about your history and experiences with academic literacy.

Once you start, you will have 2 hours to complete the following tasks:

- **Part I.** Writing Task: Summarizing a Source (30 minutes recommended)
- Part II. Writing Task: Comparative Analysis (45 minutes recommended)
- **Part III.** Survey on Past Experiences with Reading and Writing (15 minutes recommended)
- **Part IV.** Reflective Self-Assessment (30 minutes recommended)

You may return to this course space and complete the assessment at any time between Friday, June 11 and Sunday, June 20; however, once you start the assessment, you will need to complete all four parts in one sitting, so be sure to set aside two hours to dedicate to it. We recommend finding a quiet space where you can focus and ensuring that you have a reliable internet connection. The assessment is self-contained, and you do not need to do anything to prepare for it other than set aside the time and space.

While this assessment will lead to a writing course placement rather than a grade, please be aware that <u>UCI's Academic Integrity Policy</u> is in effect. It is essential that your responses be your own work to ensure that your writing course placement is the best fit to support your academic journey.
